

Faculty Highlight

Dr. Brianna Harvey is one of two new Assistant Professors of Sociology at CSUF. Dr. Harvey's educational background includes a BA in Sociology from the University of La Verne, an MSW from USC, and she obtained her PhD from UCLA. Her dissertation research explored carceral systems, community-rooted research, Black students, Black families, abolition, the education

system, and qualitative inquiry.

Dr. Harvey is a first-generation student who began her educational career at a community college before receiving her degrees. She pursued higher education because she believes there needs to be much more representation in a higher education system dominated by individuals that are not representative of the populations of the schools or communities they serve. Her goal is to bridge that gap and assist any student who is struggling. Whether it's with research or navigating higher education as a whole, she's there to help and assist!



One of the motivations Dr. Harvey had for pursuing teaching at the collegiate level was wanting to work with students and communities, which she indicates is where her passion best lies. Prior to her role at CSUF, Dr. Harvey worked as a social worker and in student affairs. She has always been passionate about helping others and researching rooted in communities most impacted by the topic. One of Dr. Harvey's proudest educational accomplishments is her dissertation titled "Defying Carceral Entrapment: Black Foster Youth Narratives of Subversion, Survival and Liberation." In this research, she looked at the classroom as a carceral space in which she feels the most pride in. She felt it was a very special study because she had the opportunity to interview students she had known for a few years, making the research even more meaningful and impactful. She expressed that this rapport added a richness to the data that would not have existed otherwise.

Dr. Harvey currently teaches Sociology 300: Social Work. She shared her experience of rebuilding and restructuring the class into something completely new and different from the ground up, which has been both a challenging and enjoyable experience for her. She hopes to assist students in looking at social work through a critical lens and to create engaging content that encourages critical thinking.

The Pantry provides support to CSUF students who are experiencing food insecurity by stocking a variety of food products, such as canned foods and fresh produce. Any enrolled student may schedule a visit, regardless of their financial situation or the number of units enrolled. Unable to make your appointment within your appointment window? Just reschedule! Visitors will have a 15-minute grace period after their scheduled appointment to show up; after which, you will be asked to reschedule. All visitors will experience a private setting; only the appointment holder may shop during their appointment time; everyone else is free to wait outside. The program collaborates with Tuffy's Basic Needs to offer additional options for support in other areas of basic needs insecurity and associated difficulties in addition to The Pantry's services.
